These light and heavy machines require both operators to run them and mechanics to fix them. Apprentices and trainees will be required to learn how to use them. These heavy equipment jobs include many of the fundamental jobs. Some heavy machines that performs particular tasks consists of wreckers, crane operators, drivers telehandler operators and excavator operators. A CDL or commercial driver's license is one of the necessary requirements for obtaining such work. A CDL can be attained via our heavy equipment training programs.

Several heavy machine jobs would require the operator to have a CDL and most will need the operator to attain extra qualifications. A crane operator for instance has to undergo an in-depth training course which include different certification programs before being able to operate an overhead crane. Several heavy equipment truck drivers on the other hand could only need some other site specific training as well as their CDL. The in-depth training which follows certain machinery is needed as much of the work happens in hazardous scenarios and dangerous scenes so the operator should be able to ensure a safe working surroundings all the time. The safety training is vital together with the communications training that helps the crew on the ground be able to always communicate with the operator.

Because of the extreme environments these equipment work under, they are often put under incredible strain on a regular basis. This means there are a lot of heavy machinery jobs available for the repair and maintenance of the machines. Operators of heavy machines are really trained workers who can repair, diagnose and troubleshoot heavy machines in a work shop or on site. Mechanics have to be available to transport their tools to a job site and perform maintenance and repair in various conditions.

It could be possible for delivery drivers to acquire work with simply a CDL, although for various jobs, certain endorsements might be required. Like for example, delivering huge pieces of machines or parts that are exceptionally huge for building projects would require the driver to finish further training in order to haul and handle huge loads. Normally, the drivers operate with chaperone vehicles that are driven by trained drivers. These chaperone vehicles typically escort the delivery truck to its destination.
