Hence, forklift training programs are necessary both for businesses and for individuals searching for work in industries as forklift operators. Forklift training focuses on health and safety issues involved in making use of forklifts. Safety concerns affect both the operator of the forklift and personnel and other people who are near the forklift. Companies could be subject to penalties if they are caught with drivers who are uncertified during an inspection. There are many convincing reasons why businesses must abide by forklift standards.

Before the worker or trainee is certified to operate a forklift, most provincial, federal and state regulations will need the employee undergo an evaluation of the skills needed for forklift safety. There are many forklift certification schools providing courses for employees and there are likewise schools that provide on line forklift training. Nevertheless, employers must know that forklift certification training is not "just a test". Correct forklift training should include several fields of study, such as theory and hands-on practice. Regulations do not require employers to have an outside organization to certify operators of forklifts.

The suggested program for a quality forklift certification service includes both an onsite component and classroom training. Classroom training typically features informative sessions with power point presentations, videos, discussions and models. Students usually should write a test to check for subject matter comprehension. Certificates of completion are given upon successful completion of the class.

An evaluation of the student's use of the equipment consists of pre-operational equipment inspections, knowledge of job site hazards, a pass/fail operational test and operational instruction.

Training normally comprises the following subject areas: Controls & Instrumentations; Understanding legislations and regulations; Steering and Maneuvering; Engine Operation and Maintenance; Visibility, Fork & Attachment Limitations; Rated Capacities, Stability, Inspection & Maintenance; Refueling; Load Control; Pedestrians, and Dangerous Places & Rough Terrain Operation. In addition, there are training courses offered for workers who are transitioning to new job positions.
